

NON-STRAIGHT LINES


HERE ARE SOME VERY COMMON TERMS YOU NEED TO REMEMBER




MAN ENGRAILED.

It is sometimes a matter of opinion whether a line is indented or dancetty

HERE ARE LESS-COMMON TERMS THAT YOU'LL MEET BUT COULD LOOK UP



AND THESE ARE EVEN LESS COMMON



Invected is the opposite of engrailed, with the points sticking inwards

Describe the line before giving the tincture – ie 'a fess engrailed sable', rather than 'a fess sable engrailed'.






